

FEATURED FIRE PROTECTION PROJECT

Oakridge Park, the site of the previous Oakridge Mall in Vancouver, is the largest single development within Vancouver since the construction of the Olympic Village.



Height and building width increases will change the redevelopment's total residential floor area to 3.031 million sq. ft. The office space component has also increased 810,436 sq. ft. The total retail floor area will be 1.206 million sq. ft. Overall, the redevelopment's total floor area will increase to about 5.05 million sq. ft. Upon the full completion of all phases, projected to be in 2027, the new Oakridge development will have over 7,000 residents and 6,000 permanent on-site jobs related to the retail, office, public park, and community centre.

Gisborne is the key Fire Protection Contractor on this project and we anticipate being on site for 3 - 4 years, providing the installation of the various fire protection systems required for a project of this magnitude.

While this is the major project within Fire Protection at this time, between our Alberta and BC Divisions we are actively working on more than 30 total projects, including wrapping up work a the Amazon distribution centre in Edmonton. In addition we continue to have success in providing project support for industrial projects throughout the world.

We have ongoing work at the **Brucejack Mine in NW BC**, providing support for various installations and expansion projects at the mine.


The Okanagan
